As we turn the corner into the second half of the year, one thing is clear-where we gather, great things happen.



On January 1st, 2025, a new chapter began in the history of JCI Ibadan as JCIN Amb. Olajumoke Victoria Adelabu assumed leadership as the 3rd female President in the chapter's 57-year legacy. Her emergence was not only historic—it sparked renewed hope, bold expectations, and a united commitment to excellence. With the theme "Raising the Bar," her administration set out to build on the labors of our heroes past while stretching the boundaries of what's possible.

Six months later, the results speak loudly.

The year started strong with a comprehensive Joint Officers Training School for the 2025 Board Members—organized in collaboration with other Local Organizations in Ibadan. This powerful retreat became a launchpad for effective leadership, strategic planning, and internal synergy. Project Chairpersons were not left behind; the Project Mastery Summit followed shortly after, delivering advanced training in project management and execution.

JCI Ibadan Hosts "The Future of Enterprise"

The sixth General Assembly of JCI Ibadan in 2025 became a landmark gathering of forward-thinking professionals. entrepreneurs, and policy enthusiasts. With a commitment to bridging the gap between enterprise and governance, the assembly created a platform to discuss strategies, policies, and the political dynamics shaping Nigeria's business landscape.

The keynote address was delivered by Hon. Seyi Adisa, Founder of the African Governance Institute for Development (AGID), on the theme: "The Future of Enterprise: Strategies, Policies, Politics." He emphasized that government policies are critical to business growth, investor confidence, and economic stability. He highlighted the impact of policy on the stock market's 21% growth since January and called for young entrepreneurs to be proactive, informed, ready to leverage emerging opportunities such as the \$500 million Creative Fund.

Hon. Adisa also stressed the importance of government-enterprise collaboration, participatory governance, and policy advocacy as vital tools for shaping the future of enterprise in Nigeria.

The session featured a stimulating panel discussion with three distinguished Azeez Adediran (venture speakers: Jumoke Olowookere capitalist), (entrepreneur), and Olamide Agbomeji (pharmacist and event planner)—who shared practical insights navigating enterprise in a policy-driven economy.





For Babatunde Ojobaro, widely known as Mister Rain (#TheCorporateEntertainer), the stage was never just a platform-it was a calling. From dancing in primary school corridors to commanding high-profile events across Nigeria, his journey reflects purpose, creativity, and reinvention.

Mister Rain's creative spark ignited early, winning dance competitions and entertaining crowds long before the fame. At Olabisi Onabanjo University, where he studied Marketing, he transitioned into comedy and stage performance, finding his true voice as an MC and actor. This passion led him to study Theatre Arts at the University of Ibadan—where he became a campus sensation.

After university, Mister Rain soared in media, earning acclaim as an award-winning On-Air Personality and media mentor. His accolades include OAP of the Year (2015-2017), Top 50 Influential Youths in Ibadan, and more. He's trained over 100 aspiring broadcasters and empowered 200+ SMEs with digital marketing skills.

Beyond securing their release, JCI Ibadan provided both individuals with financial support to help them navigate their first week outside custody, with a focus on basic needs and reintegration.

An unexpected yet inspiring moment came in court, where Alhaji Ahmed Ishola, a respected Mogaji and real estate consultant, offered to help by providing employment or trade training opportunities. Waris accepted the offer and has promised to follow through. Adesina, on the other hand, expressed his desire to return home and continue his butchering business with his grandmother's support.

As part of our commitment, both young men were re-sensitized on the importance of positive choices and making the most of their second chance.

They expressed deep appreciation for the support received and are determined to begin again with dignity.

Together, we press on—one case, one life at a time.



Access to Quality Health: JCI Ibadan Brings Vital Care to Agbeni Market

On June 28th, JCI Ibadan successfully concluded the 2025 edition of its annual Access to Quality Health Project, delivering critical medical care and health education to over 200 market women at Agbeni Market. Ibadan North West LGA.

This year's project was a two-day initiative designed to reach underserved communities with essential medical services and vital health awareness. The program kicked off with a virtual session on Maternal and Newborn Health, empowering pregnant women, nursing mothers, caregivers, and young adults with knowledge to improve maternal and child wellbeing-aligned with the 2025 World Health Day theme.

The on-ground medical outreach brought free consultations, dental care, and a range of basic medical tests-including blood pressure, blood sugar, malaria, HIV screening, BMI checks, eye screening, and oral health services. Each beneficiary received personalised advice and treatments to address immediate health needs and promote early detection and preventive care.

This impactful project was made possible through strategic partnerships with renowned health-focused organisations, including the Young Pharmacists Group, Dental Students' Association (UCH Chapter), Association of Young Physiotherapists, and the Association for Reproductive and Family Health (ARFH).

By reaching vulnerable traders who form the backbone of the local economy, JCI Ibadan reaffirms its commitment to building healthier, more resilient communities—one outreach at a time.
