January Business Meeting

HIGHLIGHTS

Setting the Year in Motion

The January Business Meeting of JCI Ìbàdàn always feels different. While it remains a General Assembly, it carries a special sense of expectancy—the first full gathering of the year, the moment leadership officially settles in, and the point when the LO year truly begins to take shape.

That moment arrived on the 4th of January 2026. Members came expecting a regular meeting, unaware that only days earlier, it was uncertain whether a physical gathering would even hold. An unexpected notice of reconstruction at Citron Hotel Business Hall unsettled plans and raised questions about moving online or possible low turnout.

Quietly and efficiently, the Board resolved the challenge. With the President, **JCIN Amb. Oluwaseun Ayedogbon**, leading alongside the Executive Vice President, Treasurer, General Secretary, and other Board Members, alternative venues were explored, logistics handled, and a new location secured. By meeting day, the January Business Meeting held smoothly at Bon Hotel, commencing promptly at 2:00 p.m.

As recognition began, it became evident this was no ordinary General Assembly. Past Presidents from administrations spanning 2016 through the Immediate Past President of 2025 were present, a powerful reminder that JCI Ìbàdàn's legacy of leadership remains actively involved. The presence of the National President, **JCIN Amb. Akinbode Abitogun**, along with representatives from sister local organisations, further reinforced this sense of collective support.

Another milestone came with the induction of seven new members. Their entry into the organisation was made easier by **JCI Senator Sina Adegunle**, Personality of the Month, who graciously covered fifty percent of their annual dues.

Parliamentary discussions were led by the General Legal Counsel, financial reports reflected a healthy balance exceeding two million naira, and plans of action for the year were adopted.

A major highlight was the training session facilitated by **JCI Senator Muiwa Bamgose**, **President of JCI Ìbàdàn in 1984**, on “**How Strategic Leaders Create Impact.**” His session felt less like training and more like wisdom passed across generations.

By the close of the meeting, one thing was clear—**the year had officially begun.**



Leading with Purpose: My 2024 Journey with JCI Ibadan

Leading Junior Chamber International, Ibadan in 2024 was more than holding a title—it was about holding purpose steady in a year that demanded courage, clarity, and conviction. Every decision, conversation, and action was guided by SAIL (Synergy, Acceleration, Intentionality, and Leverage). It wasn't just a framework; it became the lens through which I lived leadership every day.

The year began under pressure. We had no funds. I assumed office barely seven months after the total removal of the fuel subsidy, in a fragile economy where costs were unpredictable and optimism scarce. Yet, challenges became opportunities. Through financial discipline and collective accountability, we ended the year with a substantial balance in the organization's account, proving that responsible leadership can thrive even in uncertainty.

People and growth were at the heart of every action. I encouraged nine members to attend the Trainers Academy and five graduated, stepping into new leadership roles with confidence. Watching them grow was a reminder that leadership is not about titles—it's about lifting others, building capacity, and leaving the organization stronger than you met it.

2024 was also a lesson in humanity. Friendships were built, trust was strengthened, and difficult decisions sometimes made some people turn their backs. Yet, all high and medium priority projects were executed successfully, and even the toughest years can produce a lasting impact. Leading JCI Ibadan taught me that true leadership is doing what matters, together, with purpose.

Reflections on Leadership and Succession: My story as the IPP and the chairman of the 2025 board

I was fortunate to have a successor who led with clarity, confidence, and respect, trusting the process and letting me advise without interference. Collaboration happened when needed, and space was given when it mattered most.

The experience taught me that succession is not about replacing someone. It's about building on a legacy while creating your own. Leadership thrives when guided by trust, respect, and shared purpose.

Board Strategic Meetings and Partnerships

When the 2026 leadership spoke about Amplify Impact, it was clear from the outset that it was not intended to remain a theme on paper. There was a shared understanding within the Board that amplification had to show up first in how the year was prepared, how decisions were made, and how the organisation positioned itself before any public activity began. So before projects were rolled out, before engagements were announced, and before visibility became a focus, the administration concentrated on getting its internal rhythm right.

That process began with leadership alignment.

One of the first deliberate actions of the Board was a strategy training session facilitated by **JCI Sen. Kolawole Osinowo**. The session focused on practical leadership thinking and execution, using an interactive Lego building exercise to explore how structure, roles, and coordination affect outcomes. Rather than lectures, the session encouraged participation and honest conversation. It helped clarify how decisions should flow, how priorities should be set, and how leadership responsibilities connect across the year. By the end of the session, the Board shared a clearer, simpler understanding of how it intended to work together in 2026.



Following this initial alignment, the administration moved into a series of strategic Board meetings throughout December 2025 and January 2026. These meetings were working sessions, focused on planning and coordination rather than ceremony. Project timelines were discussed, internal processes reviewed, and responsibilities mapped across directorates.

The goal was straightforward: to ensure that ideas were translated into clear actions and that execution across the year would be coordinated and realistic. These sessions helped move the year from intention into structure.



The Board also prioritised strengthening relationships with alumni early in the year. Recognising the value of experience and continuity, the administration began engaging key alumni as far back as December 2025. Courtesy visits were paid to **JCI Sen. Babajide Olatunde-Agbeja**, **JCI Sen. Sina Adegunle** and **JCI Sen. Muyiwa Bamgbose**, creating space for guidance, reflection, and perspective.

These conversations allowed the Board to share its direction for 2026 while learning from leaders who have shaped the organisation over time. The emphasis was not on formality, but on continuity, mentorship, and staying connected to the organisation's institutional memory.

Alongside internal preparation and alumni engagement, the administration also focused on securing strategic partnerships on how JCI Ibadan's work would be communicated throughout the year.

Media partnerships were identified as a practical part of amplification. Early conversations led to partnerships with radio stations including **Success FM, 32 FM, Crest FM, Dominion FM/TV, and Jordan FM**. These platforms provide consistent channels for sharing projects, conversations, and advocacy efforts, helping ensure that the organisation's work reaches beyond its immediate membership and into the wider Community.



Together, these early trainings, meetings, visits, and pa reflect how the 2026 administration set its working frequency.

All leadership frequency started with preparation, alignment, and connection, laying a steady foundation for the work that follows.



SINA ADEGUNLE BUSINESS SUMMIT (SABS) 2026



AMPLIFY IMPACT *in Practice*

The Sina Adegunle Business Summit is one of JCI Ibadan's most established and impactful programmes. Now in its sixth year, the summit has evolved into a practical platform where young entrepreneurs, early-stage founders, students, and business owners come together to learn, connect, and access genuine support for their ideas. Each edition is designed not just to inspire conversation, but to create opportunities that can move businesses forward. The 2026 edition, themed Amplify Impact, continued this tradition. Held at Daylan Event Centre in Ibadan, the summit brought together over 400 participants, including corps members, startup founders, business owners, students, and JCI members from different local organisations.

The atmosphere reflected the purpose of the event: focused, engaging, and rooted in collaboration. The keynote session set the tone for the day, **Dr. Tope Odetayo, Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of Top Success Media and Group of Companies**, spoke on job creation and business sustainability, drawing from his experience as a media entrepreneur and employer. His address focused on the importance of planning, structure, and intentional decision-making in building businesses that can survive beyond their early stages.

He encouraged participants to take their passions seriously, but to back them with strategy, discipline, and collaboration, stressing that growth rarely happens in isolation.

A major highlight of the summit was the Business Pitch Competition, which has become a defining feature of SABS over the years. After a screening process that produced ten shortlisted businesses, five finalists were selected to pitch live at the event. Each finalist presented a business idea before a panel of judges made up of experienced professionals and entrepreneurs. The judging process was interactive and transparent, with clear criteria and probing questions that tested the feasibility, scalability, and sustainability of each idea.

The winner, CEO MokxyClothier was thrilled to take home a generous cash prize of **₦1,600,000, along with a variety of other fantastic gifts and benefits. What a delightful reward!** Her performance was truly impressive, captivating the **CEO, Grace and Mercy, who generously donated ₦500,000. JCI Sen. Goodness Morakinyo** was equally amazed by the depth of her business presentation and, moved by the honoree, contributed an additional **₦500,000**. Moreover, the Past Presidents present, including JCI Amb Wale Agbomeji, JCI Sen. Abolusodun, and Ogo Ibadan, collectively donated **₦100,000**. It truly was a beautiful moment filled with joy and honor!

The summit also created space for corps members who had started businesses during their service year. Selected participants were allowed to pitch their ideas and received cash prizes alongside media publicity support through Top Success Radio. This segment highlighted JCI Ibadan's commitment to encouraging entrepreneurship at early stages and recognising initiative wherever it emerges.

Partnerships played an important role in the delivery of the 2026 summit. Collaborations with NYSC Corp members, private business owners, media organisations, and supporting institutions strengthened both the reach and execution of the programme. These partnerships helped ensure that the summit remained accessible, well coordinated, and relevant to a broad audience.

Beyond the programme flow and headline moments, the true measure of the summit was found in the people in the room. Throughout the day, conversations continued long after sessions ended, ideas were exchanged in quiet corners, and connections were formed that extended beyond the event itself. Do you know that the Sina Adegunle Business Summit is not just an annual business event for JCI Ibadan? This year edition carried an added layer of meaning.

This summit, held on 16th January 2026, coincided once again with **Senator Sina Adegunle's birthday** and in a moment that felt both symbolic and personal, the Chairman of the 2026 Sina Adegunle Business Summit, **JC Amos Adejesubisi**, shares the same birthday date. The convergence of these moments added a unique significance to the day, making it one of the unforgettable in the history of the Sina Adegunle's Business Summit.

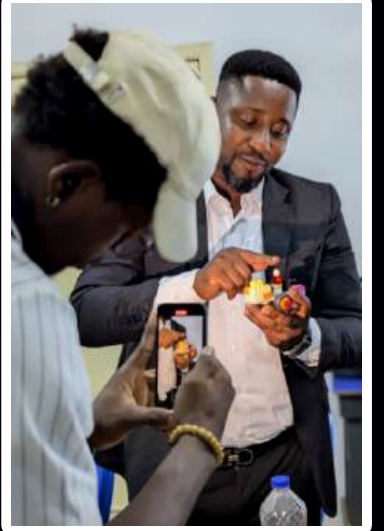

January marked a strong and purposeful start for the Directorate. We successfully inducted seven (7) new members into JCI Ibadan.

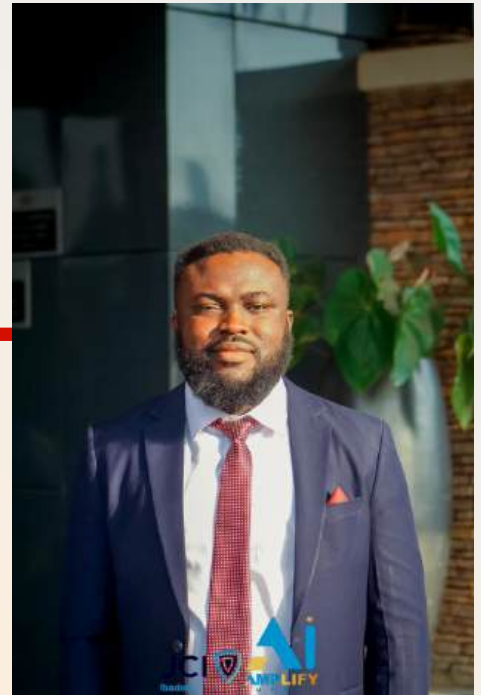
